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JOURNEY OF KINDNESS!

"The Compassionate Journey of Kim Dung and the Sara Association for Difficult Circumstances in Vietnam." The article recounts the visits of Kim Dung and the charitable efforts of the Sara Association, sharing touching stories from their trips as well as their efforts to assist the poor, disabled, and orphaned.

Dear Benefactors, For 32 years, Kim Dung has been blessed with the opportunity to return to Vietnam to visit the less fortunate. To date, Kim Dung has made 45 trips back, with some years including as many as two visits. In 2025, Kim Dung has to care for her ailing sister and therefore cannot return to Vietnam.

Over the years, the Association has sent money with the help and collaboration of priests and nuns, enabling the charitable work of the Sara Association to develop systematically. Thus, the absence of the Association in the upcoming visits will not affect its programs in Vietnam. This is because the work of the Association has been well carried out by the priests and nuns, who have personally delivered gifts to leprosy patients, the disabled, orphans, and lonely, impoverished elderly individuals.

Moreover, throughout the years, the Association has established 16 SARA medical clinics to assist impoverished patients who cannot afford hospital care. Two of these clinics were equipped with ultrasound machines purchased by the Association to support medical examinations. These two clinics are operated by nuns and do not carry the Sara Association's name but instead bear the name of the nuns' congregation, aiming to provide medical care to the poor and to a thousand suffering leprosy patients. Kim Dung fondly remembers the visit to disabled individuals during August's Mid-Autumn Festival. After distributing rice and mooncakes, the car drove into the church area. Kim Dung saw a large crowd gathered, the noise of chatting and laughter filling the air. Parents were leading their disabled children into the yard. Despite their illnesses, the children were joyful because they knew they would receive mooncakes, as Mid-Autumn Festival is their special celebration. At that moment, Kim Dung felt uplifted witnessing the bustling and cheerful scene filled with laughter from disabled children. After the gifts were distributed, some parents approached Kim Dung to express their gratitude to the benefactors abroad.

When handing out the gifts, Kim Dung mentioned that these were contributions from overseas benefactors, and that Kim Dung, representing the Sara Association, was delivering them personally. Kim Dung asked everyone to pray for the benefactors. Later, a woman confided her struggles in caring for her child over many decades. She cried, and Kim Dung could not hold back her tears of sympathy. Suddenly, a group of people gathered around Kim Dung and burst into tears, as if their pain was overflowing—each deeply distressed by their own circumstances.

A moment later, the Sister guided Kim Dung to several families with children suffering from paralysis. Among them, there was a very young family with a child who had been paralyzed since birth, lying on the bed with dull eyes, as if lifeless. At that moment, the Sister called out to the child, and suddenly the child opened their eyes as the Sister held a mooncake in front of them. It was truly miraculous, the child's eyes widened, their face lit up with joy, and they immediately asked their mother to help them sit up, their eyes fixated on the mooncake in the Sister's hand. At that moment, the Sister lifted the curtain, and the child could no longer see the cake. The child stretched and struggled, trying to find where the Sister had placed the cake. Watching this, Kim Dung felt a deep sense of sorrow and compassion. Kim Dung also understood the poverty of the family, where sweets and cakes were a rare treat. When Kim Dung gave rice to the young mother, she held the bag of rice tightly, her eyes brimming with emotion as if she were about to cry. In contrast, the Sister gave a cake to the child, who smiled and hugged it tightly to their chest as if it were a precious treasure. When they were leaving, the Sister said goodbye to the child and jokingly asked to share the cake with them, but the child shook their head. Witnessing this, Kim Dung felt great compassion for the child and deep sorrow for impoverished, disabled children. Kim Dung deeply hopes that in the autumn of 2025, many children will find a bit of happiness. She asks everyone to lend a hand and show kindness to the children on their special day so that they may experience a little joy.

SERVING WITH FAITH AND TRUST

In the message for the first World Day of the Poor in 2017, His Holiness the Pope wrote: "How praiseworthy are those hands stretched out to the poor to assist them, for these hands bring hope. How praiseworthy are the hands that overcome any cultural, religious, or national barriers to pour the oil of consolation upon humanity's wounds. How praiseworthy are the hands that open up without expecting anything in return, without saying 'if,' or 'but,' or 'maybe'; these hands bring God's blessings to our brothers and sisters."

The ongoing reflection of the Church regarding the silent and ever-deepening mission to serve the poor resonates strongly within the heart of the Superior of the Saint Anthony Association. Under the influence of the Holy Spirit, in 2017, he gathered and founded an association of male consecrated religious, serving in the model of Saint Anthony of Padua, known for performing miracles. The spirituality of **''humble service with faith and trust''** and the mission of **preaching and healing are at its core**.

In 2009, together with the Sara Charity Association, the congregation established the Antôn–Sara general clinic system, which combines Eastern and Western medicine to provide healthcare for the poor, disabled, and lonely, regardless of religion. As of 2025, there are 12 clinics across the provinces of Nghệ An and Hà Tĩnh. Recognizing the large number of impoverished individuals, especially those with mental illnesses, orphans, homeless individuals, and those with cerebral palsy who lacked care, and inspired by the zeal to serve the image of Christ through the less



fortunate, the Superior began building the first Antôn Shelter at the parish of Cồn Mộc, Nghi Văn Commune, Nghi Lộc District, Nghệ An Province in early 2021. The shelter welcomed nearly 40 initial patients. Currently, the congregation has established two additional shelters in Yên Thành District and Hưng Nguyên District of Nghệ An Province, bringing the total number of residents in the three shelters to over 150 individuals.

That being said, stepping into reality is no easy task. First to mention are the external factors involved in caring for these patients. This is a group of patients with specific physical, physiological, and psychological characteristics, requiring caregivers to have skills and the ability to adapt. Sometimes, when a patient has an episode, they lose normal awareness and behavior, or there are times when their condition worsens

and they become aggressive. This demands significant effort and experience from the caregivers to handle. There are moments when the shelter lacks daily food supplies to prepare meals for the patients. Nevertheless, the brothers always place their trust and surrender in God and Saint Anthony, running from one market to another, from place to place, asking for vegetables, fish, bottles of fish sauce, or shallots to cook meals for the patients. Despite these many difficulties, the joys are countless. In the spirit of service, following the example of Saint Anthony, the brothers strive to overcome hardships and bring love and care to the patients. They only hope that their small, quiet acts of service can help alleviate the suffering endured by the impoverished and ill. As the song says: "Send me to every corner of the land, to bring food to the poor, and water to the thirsty. Send me to every home, to give medicine to the sick, and blankets to those shivering in the cold." May God send abundant blessings upon us and open the hearts of benefactors to show kindness to the shelter so that we may better serve and care for the patients. May God bless and grant everyone more grace, always

Dear Association, the Congregation of Saint Anthony has the mission to proclaim the Gospel and care for, nurture, and support the disabled, orphans, lonely individuals, and the elderly. Thanks to the grace of God and the support of benefactors, the Congregation currently operates 12 clinics providing healthcare for the poor without discrimination between religious beliefs and manages 3 centers that care for over 150 patients with mental illness, disabilities, cerebral palsy, and more.

There are few patrons and charities to offer assistance, but fortunately, the Sara Association has provided consistent support over the years, enabling the maintenance and operation of these facilities.
